PRESIDENTS LETTER FROM PAUL KRUEGER

- We're closing in on the end of the 2011-12 racquetball season and the Wisconsin Racquetball Association (WRA) is continuing to try to recruit players, grow racquetball interest among juniors and do as much for our members as possible.
- We are in the process of updating our member list and also updating our web site (wiracquetball.org) to make it easier to use and more interactive. Our Facebook page is getting more hits and is a great place to communicate with other racquetball players and catch up with what is happening in the racquetball world.
- Our one-year membership fee continues to stay at \$15 as well as our one-event exemption fee of \$5 that will allow players to play in any WRA-sanctioned tournaments. One fantastic benefit of membership is a hotel deal with the Sheraton Hotel - Milwaukee (right off Hwy. 94 on Moorland Rd.) for all WRA members. During the weekends of the Wisconsin State Singles and Doubles Tournaments at the Wisconsin Athletic Club in West Allis (WAC), WRA members will be able to reserve rooms for just \$59/night! They will also give WRA members a rate of \$69/night any other time throughout the year (with blackout dates applying). This is a tremendous benefit of your WRA membership and the first of what we hope are more to come. Go to the WRA web site and click on the membership button to reserve rooms online.
- Our switch to the Ektelon Classic Black ball has been a hit due to truer bounces than other balls in the market, of which most are too bouncy.
- The (WAC) will host the 2012 Wisconsin State Singles Tournament on March 2-3 (tourney will go to Saturday if draw is larger than expected). If you haven't played in recent years, please consider playing this year as the atmosphere is great and the tourney always well-run by Trish Beatty, Jamie Defouw and the rest of the WAC crew. It is a great way to measure yourself against the state's best players at your level and also see toplevel racquetball played by guys like Andy Thompson, (known as the hardest hitter on the planet), Kyle Veenstra and Matt Stamborski among others.

- The Prairie Athletic Club (PAC) will host the 2012 Wisconsin Junior State Tournament on Saturday, March 17 (some matches may be played on March 16 if draw is larger than expected). We have a number of top-notch junior players in our state, led by Justus Benson one of the top 13-year-olds in the world. Junior programs appear to be growing around the state, so hopefully we have a good turnout for State Juniors and other WRA junior events.
- I'd also like to reach out to college players around the state to be a part of the WRA and see what we can do to help your programs. If you are running leagues or a tourney at your college and need some help or info to get started, please let me know. If you're looking to run a clinic with the help of racquetball professionals, let me know and we can hopefully help you grow your program.
- The PAC will also host the Wisconsin State Doubles Tournament on November 9-11 (tentatively), for those of you looking to mark your calendars. Don't forget also that the PAC will host its Summer Open in September and that the International Racquetball Tour will make its only stop in Wisconsin when it comes to the PAC for the 15th Annual Lou Bradley Memorial Pro-Am in December.
- We are in the process of building our WRA membership and our bank account so we can do more events for members and juniors, such as the free event hosted by the PAC on February 11.
- The WRA is looking for a college player to join the WRA board and be a voice for the college-aged crowd. We can use all the help we can get to push the sport of racquetball in our great state so if you have an interest in serving on the board, giving WRA members a discount through your business or doing anything else to help please contact me. As always, if you have comments or suggestions for the WRA, contact myself or somebody on the board so we can be responsive to the thoughts and needs of Wisconsin's racquetball players. KELLY WHALEN TO ENTER WRA HALL OF FAME

Kelly Whalen will be inducted into the Wisconsin Racquetball Association Hall of Fame as the Class of 2012 at 7:30 p.m. on Saturday, March 3, 2012 during the State Singles Tour-nament at the Wisconsin Athletic Club - West Allis.

Kelly has been a top Women's Open player in Wisconsin for the past 20 years. Moving to Wisconsin in 1991, Kelly burst onto the racquet-ball scene by teaming with sister, Kim, and taking 2nd in that year's Women's Open Doubles in the State Tournament. She and Kim teamed to take the title in 1995, 1997 and 2011. They placed 2nd in 96 and 2000. The Whalen team also teamed to win the 20+ Open in 95, 25+ Open in 96 and Women's All-Age in 02. Kelly, with various male team-mates, won the All-Aged Mixed in 01 and 05, along with a 2nd in Mixed Open in 01.

When she has played in our State Singles tournaments she has excelled, win-ning the Women's Open in 2005, 06, 07, 08 and 10. She placed 2nd in 2011, along with making it to the semi-finals in 1992 and 93. In the Age Groups Kelly won the 25+ Open in 95, and placed 2nd in the 15+ Open in 92 and 30+ Open in 93.

Kelly has played in a number of Women's National Senior Masters Tourn-aments and won the 35+ in Los Angeles and Detroit in 2001 and 2002. She place second in 1999 and was in the semis in 2000. Also, in 1993 Kelly won the Women's Open at the USRA Regionals in Chicago

We know Kelly has enjoyed sharing her doubles success with sister Kim. All of us want to congratule Kelly on her induction into our WRA Hall of Fame.

GREG BEATTY TO RECEIVE BRADLEY/STOLTMANN SPORTSMANSHIP AWARD

Current Men's Open Doubles Champion, Greg Beatty, will be receiving the 2012 WRA Lou Bradley/Jerry Stoltmann Sportsmanship Award at the Awards Presentation portion of the WRA State Singles Tournament at 7:30 p.m. on Saturday, March 3. SUPREME HEALTH AND FITNESS TO INDUCT KIM WHALEN IN THEIR HALL OF FAME

Traditionally we have waited until players have wrapped up their tournament days before bestowing this honor on them, but Kim's accomplishments may continue to grow indefinitely and she really deserves a place on our wall of fame. She will join Wisconsin racquetball legends Joe Wirkus, Ivan Bruner, Chet Howard, Brian Parrott and Karen Ducharme as our next inductee. Kim's list of victories is impressive and she continues to play at the highest level in our state year after year along with twin sister Kelly. If you have ever been on the court with her you know she is among the most accurate shooters you will ever run across. This ability along with her tremendous commitment to her fitness level allows her to dominate in women's play as well as compete against top level men's players. She continues to impress us all with what she can do on a racquetball court Supreme looks forward to her continued success in the years to come.

CROWTHER WINS RACQUETBALL TITLE

- Determined to show his mettle after being derailed by a back injury in the final of the 2010 tourney, Chris Crowther leaned on power, reach and shot-making ability to win the 14th Annual Lou Bradley Memorial Pro-Am Racquetball Tournament this weekend at the Prairie Athletic Club in Sun Prairie, Wisc.
- Crowther, the No. 4 player on the International Racquetball Tour (IRT), dropped the first game, but rallied to defeat Cleveland's Andy Hawthorne (No. 6) 6-11, 11-5, 11-6, 12-10. Crowther earned \$2,500 with the victory, while Hawthorne brought home a \$1,500 check for reaching the final.
- The 24-player draw featured four of the top 13-ranked players in the world and another dozen players among the best in the Midwest.
- Crowther controlled Green Bay's Kyle Hermans and Chicago's Geoff Goldblatt in the first two round, then rolled over upset-minded Andy Thompson in the semis. Thompson, who hits the ball nearly 200 miles per hour and is the hardest hitter on the planet, had taken out 13-ranked Juan Herrera in the

- quarters ((11-6, 11-7, 11-5), but was swept 11-3, 11-2, 11-7 by Crowther in the semis.
- Hawthorne took care of Minnesota youth sensation Jordan Barth and PAC's own Tracy Chynoweth to advance to the semis. There he met Fond du Lac native Tony Carson (No. 10) and survived a grueling 11-6, 11-6, 9-11, 13-11 victory to reach the final.
- Carson swept past PAC's Paul Krueger in the quarters, while Chynoweth defeated Matt Stamborski in a marathon match that lasted nearly three hours 12-14, 11-13, 12-10, 11-8, 11-8 coming back from 8-0 and 8-3 deficits in two of his three game victories in the most compelling match of the pro draw.
- Green Bay's Joey Salamone had an incredible run in the Mens Open draw, winning four straight matches to take the Pro dropdown title. After defeating his brother Dan, Joey beat state champ Matt Stamborski and Iowa standouts Ryan Ratchford and Blake Hanson for the \$200 check.
- Barth beat Salamone in the pro draw, lost to fellow Minnesotan Lee Mienerz in the

- Open draw, but bounced back to win three straight matches and top Krueger for consolation title. Barth's junior partner, Sun Prairie's Justus Benson, won the Mens AA consolation crown.
- Kyle Veenstra, who lost to Thompson in the state final this past March, won the 35+Open title, defeating state power Jay Wollenberg for the title.
- Hawthorne teamed with Iowa's Bryan Crosser to topple Wisconsin state champs Wollenberg and Greg Beatty in the Mens Open doubles division.
- Jesi Haak (PAC) had a fantastic tourney, winning all three of her matches to take the Womens Open crown and teaming with Becky Denniston (PAC) to take the Womens Open doubles title.
- Matches ran from 1 p.m. to 2 a.m. on Friday; 7 a.m. until midnight Saturday and 7 a.m. until about 6 p.m. Sunday in the tourney, sponsored by Sussek Machine.
- The draw featured more than players in 20 divisions and raised more than \$700 for the Lou Bradley Scholarship Fund. The results of the tournament are listed below.

TWO TIME NATIONAL PADDLE CHAMPION, PAUL NELSON, DIES AT AGE 80 ON FEBRUARY 9

I still remember the finals of the 1962 National Paddleball Championships in Madison. It was one of the toughest court matches I've ever seen. My dad, Bill Schultz, won a tough three game match against defending National Champion Paul Nelson. Paul even was knocked out during one tough rally, getting hit in the head with the paddle. Along with his 1961 title, Paul also won the title in 1963. During the 1960's Madison was a hotbed of paddle-ball and racquetball. Along with Paul and my dad, young Bill Schmidtke worked and played at the YMCA. A fun story I remember was when both my dad and Paul lost in the semi's at the National Paddleball Tournament in the mid-60's and brought the 3rd place trophy back and played for it at noon one day.

In those paddleball days, you did not have to wear a tether on your wrist and Paul, being very ambidextrous, would switch hands and play with two forehands. Once racquetball became more popular than paddleball. Paul changed over and was an outstanding player, but probably wished he could continue to switch hands, as he had to work on that backhand. I feel blessed that all my years around paddleball and racquetball did afford me the opportunity to have known, watched, admired and played guys like Paul Nelson, Bill Schmidtke and my dad. What wonderful memories!

BLAST FROM THE PAST

WISCONSIN RACQUETBALL ASSOCIATION ANNOUNCES HALL-OF-FAME AND INAUGURAL INDUCTEES

- The Wisconsin Racquetball Association Board of Directors has voted to establish a Wisconsin Racquetball Association Hall-of-Fame to recognize those Wisconsin players who have distinguished themselves through their accomplishments and contributions to racquetball. The inaugural class of inductees will include Julie Jacobsen, Larry Lederman, Bill Schultz, Sr. and Joe Wirkus.
- Julie Jacobsen has spent 25 years in the racquetball and fitness industry, and has been one of Wisconsin's top players. Along with nine Women's Open singles and doubles titles she won national doubles title in 1989 in the 35+ open division and the 40+ open in 1995. In 1990 and 1991 Julie won the 35+ division in the national women's Sr./Masters tournament.
- Larry Lederman, a former Olympic wrestler and top handball player, was Athletic Director at the Milwaukee Jewish Community Center in 1968 when he organized the first National Paddleball Gut-Racket Championships in Milwaukee. His goal was to bring the best players from paddleball and paddle rackets together. With great foresight, Lederman incorporated under the name United States Gut Paddle Association in 1967. This was the foundation that racquetball was built on. That first tournament drew 77 players from 17 states, with 40 playing in singles and 20 doubles teams. Lederman invited Bob Kendler, the handball czar, to see the tournament and hopefully put his muscle behind the new organization, which he did and the rest is history. Lederman became the first national commissioner and in 1988 was inducted into the USRA Hall-of-Fame.
- Bill Schultz, Sr. was Executive Director of the Madison YMCA's when he was one of the top paddleball players in the country in the 1960's. He won the 1963 national title and was runner-up in 62, 64, 65 and 66, losing the last two to Bud Muhlheisen. In 1968 he traveled to Milwaukee with Bill Schmidtke to play in the first National Paddleball Gut-Racket Championship, which is recognized as the first national racquetball championship. He won that first tournament at age 44 in a tremendous three game match against a 25 year-old Schmidtke, 14-21, 21-12, 21-18. Along with his national prominence, Schultz won numerous regional, state and local paddleball and racquetball tournaments. He also led the effort to build both the West and East Branch YMCA's in Madison, which expanded racquetball participation greatly.
- Joe Wirkus became Wisconsin's third national champion (Bill Schmidtke won the 71 title), winning the Men's Open title in 1976 and followed that by winning the 30+ titles in 1982 and 83. Joe was Wisconsin's most prolific state champion, winning 10 men's open titles between 1972 and 1988. He also won numerous regional titles in both singles and doubles, and won 11 men's open titles in our state doubles playing with brothers Tom and Jim. Joe has been a leader in Wisconsin's racquetball industry for most of his career and is the owner of Supreme Court and Fitness in Madison.
- The induction ceremony took place at the 2004 WRA State Singles Tournament at the Wisconsin Athletic Club West Allis on Saturday, March 27, 2004.
